

Established in 2010 and a Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence since 2016, the European Institute is UCL's hub for research, education and engagement on Europe. Internally, we enable, develop and support UCL research and teaching activities on Europe across faculties and foster an environment where work on Europe can ourish.

Externally, we engage with policy professionals, civil society and the public to maximise the reach and impact of UCL ideas and expertise.

Since 2020, the European Institute has been located in the Faculty of Laws, with funding contributions from Laws, Arts & Humanities, Social & Historical Sciences and the School of Slavonic and Eastern European Studies (SSEES).

We work across UCL's faculties to create, curate and showcase research, teaching and engagement on Europe, drawing in nep31 Tdl 1se81en (each and) Jupe.

Spotlight on European Politics, Policy and Law in Practice

This year, we delivered a new module, European Politics, Policy and Law in Practice, offered as part of the MSc in European Politics and Policy run by UCL School of Public Policy. The module complements academic study with a curated programme of conversations and skills-oriented sessions with practitioners, leveraging the Institute's strong networks across EU policymaking communities.

Sessions focused on themes from climate change and energy policy to the response to Covid-19, UK-EU relations and the EU's interinstitutional dynamics. In addition, students learned core professional skills, from stakeholder mapping to developing policy brie ngs.

12 senior practitioners from a diverse range of backgrounds contributed, and students gave the module an average rating of 4.7 out of 5.

In fact, this intensive session gave me several new ideas to use in my daily work of delivering research and analytical support for EU level decision-makers.






We hosted Professor Nomi Lazar, full Professor of Politics in the Graduate School of Politics and International Affairs at the University of Ottawa, as a Visiting Professor at UCL European Institute to pursue research on European extremist movements' use of apocalyptic rhetoric and the threat this can pose to constitutional regimes.

From political extremism to climate activism, Europe is alive with talk of apocalypse. Yet, we understand little about how and when these volatile narratives work. In the course of a wonderful visit, the European Institute hosted workshops and discussions with interdisciplinary scholars, centred around these subjects, which have significantly advanced my project to develop a core theory of apocalyptic rhetoric.


